#### Why study this?

Biology A-level will give you the skills to make connections and associations with all living things around you. A-level Biology is highly rated by universities because it provides a strong foundation for a vast range of science, healthcare, and STEM degree courses and careers, such as medicine, veterinary science, and biomedical engineering. The challenging curriculum develops essential scientific and practical skills including analysis, problem-solving, and critical thinking, making graduates more competitive for both academic and professional opportunities in fields related to the life sciences.

#### Why Ferndown?

At Ferndown modelling and exam skills are at the forefront of teaching with the required practical activities giving students the opportunity to embed their skills and knowledge. The A-level practicals ensure that students can access the Common Practical Assessment Criteria (CPAC) requirements which prepare students for Biology based university courses including medicine, dentistry, nursing and biomedical sciences.

#### Progression opportunities

According to bestcourse4me.com, the top seven-degree courses taken by students who have an A-level in Biology are:

Biology, Psychology, Sport and exercise science, Medicine, Anatomy, Physiology and Pathology Pharmacology, Toxicology and Pharmacy Chemistry and Dentistry. Careers related to biology in 2025 span healthcare, environmental science, and biotechnology, with high demand for roles like medical professionals, biotechnologists, and ecologists due to advancements in gene editing, sustainable energy, and public health research. Other popular paths include research scientists, microbiologists, forensic scientists, and genetic counsellors, with many roles requiring further specialised study beyond an undergraduate degree.

#### Transferable skills

Studying A level Biology allows students to develop skills in the writing and understanding of scientific methods, data analysis, observation, correlations and causal relationships. The ability to evaluate data, use and understand statistical tests when drawing conclusions. Biology, like all sciences, is a practical subject. The wide range of practical's you undertake will give you the skills and confidence needed to investigate the way living things behave and work. It will also ensure that you are prepared for university level Biology.

### Chemistry

Qualification	AQA A level Chemistry 7405
Why study this?	Chemistry is the science of the material world; the composition, structure and interactions of all matter in the universe and the energy associated with chemical changes. Studying chemistry will provide you an understanding of  - Changes in the environment and possible solutions to these issues  - Sugars, proteins and DNA  - Fuels and batteries to provide and store energy  - Fertilizers, food preservatives and flavourings to help us produce and store food
Why Ferndown?	At Ferndown you will find experienced, well qualified staff who are enthusiastic about their subject and want to impart that enthusiasm to you. We have a track record of getting students excellent grades and many of our students go on to study chemistry or related subjects such as biochemistry, biomedical sciences and medicine/dentistry at university. Annual trips to chemistry lectures in London will broaden your knowledge beyond the A level specification.
Progression opportunities	Chemistry is essential for many university courses such as medicine, pharmacy, veterinary and dentistry. It leads to many career paths such as forensic science, engineering, environmental science, pharmacology, patent law, scientific sales or technical writing – these could be through further courses at university or through an apprenticeship or degree apprenticeship route.

Why study this?	Early Childhood Development provides a strong foundation in both knowledge and practical skills essential for working with children. You'll gain an understanding of child development, the importance of play in learning, and key areas such as health, safeguarding, and safety—including how to respond in emergency situations. This qualification is an ideal stepping stone into degrees such as nursing, teaching, or social work, and supports strong academic performance through the development of transferable skills like research and analytical thinking.

The externally assessed units—Children's Development and Keeping Children Safe—are completed through formal examinations. The internally assessed units—Play and Learning and Research and Reflective Practice in an Early Childhood Setting—are assessed through coursework and assignment work completed throughout the course. This balanced approach allows students to demonstrate their knowledge through both written exams and practical, real-world tasks. Students are permitted to resit the examination twice. This equates to three attempts in total

Criminology is a subject that encourages you to be critical, analytical and evaluative, and is perfect for anyone inquisitive about crime, human nature or current affairs.
Why Ferndown?	Criminology is a popular subject at Ferndown. Lessons are engaging and interesting, and pupils leave the classroom feeling that they have been stretched and made progress. Pupils enjoy the relevance of the subject, and the fact that the study of it is rooted in science and contemporary issues.

#### Ethics and Philosophy

Qualification	OCR A level Religious Studies H573
Why study this?	The aim of philosophy is to search for the truth by asking the right questions and by formulating logical arguments. As there are no simple answers, it is an intellectually challenging subject.  Ethics is the study of how humans make moral decisions and the reasons we give for our decisions. It examines whether morality is relative and so changes according to time, place, or culture or whether it is absolute and certain actions are intrinsically good or bad. This subject develops the skills of reasoning and logical thought, analysis and evaluation and literacy.
Why Ferndown?	Ferndown students have a history of success in Ethics with students achieving top grades with many students finding a passion for Philosophy, leading to them continuing to study the subject at university.  Students are taught by subject specialist who have a real passion for the subject.  We have developed excellent links with the community and have an annual Theology conference at a local church where we also work with Moorlands bible college students to help students to develop their evaluation of key topics such as Gender and Euthanasia.  Students love the discussion-based lessons that we offer in Ethics which really helps students to develop the evaluation skills necessary.
Progression opportunities	Philosophy is an accepted A level for most degrees. Studying Theology, Religious Studies or Philosophy at degree level can lead to careers in teaching, police, and armed forces and many more. Qualification	AQA A level in French
Why study this?	When you learn another language, you extend your linguistic and cultural knowledge, expand your worldview and broaden your horizons. You recognise differences in values and beliefs and discover new ways of doing things, not to mention strengthen your understanding of your own cultural and linguistic background. Throughout French A level, you will have the opportunity not only to develop your knowledge of France and the French language, but of current affairs and issues across the entire Francophone world. You will also study both a film and a novel during the course.
Why Ferndown?	Here at FUS we have passionate and experienced A level teaching staff and we are constantly updating our resources to reflect current cultural awareness and language use. Students also have access to Boost Dynamic Learning which is an interactive resource platform with a wealth of material to practise all skill areas.
Progression opportunities	Language skills are highly sought after by both universities and employers. Speaking a foreign language enables you to compete in the global marketplace in a wide range of careers connected to areas such as the diplomatic service, marketing, customer service, law, business management and journalism to name a few.
